



EUSR - NATIONAL WATER HYGIENE & DOMS

The aim of the course is to:

Ensure individuals gain a rounded appropriate level of knowledge, understanding health, safety and environmental law and their associated responsibilities.

The course will equip delegates with the knowledge and skills to ensure that safety issues are managed effectively, protecting the workforce, other people and the general environment and ensuring that legal compliance is achieved.

Who Should attend?

Individuals who require access to operational sites within the NWH industry, both permanent and temporary, at all levels including operatives, supervisors and management.

Any person working on service reservoirs, pumping stations, treatment works, wells, springs boreholes and or working on the network of water mains and service pipes.
